

2021 Summer Camp Communicable Disease Protocols

All communicable disease protocols are subject to change and guidance and requirements from the CDC, NJDOH, and local officials continues to change. Any changes instituted by any of the previously mentioned parties will be implemented by the Roxbury Twp. Recreation Department as soon as possible.

Masks & Face Coverings

In accordance with the most recent guidance from the CDC and NJDOH, a mask/ face covering is **recommended** while inside any school or rec department building. A mask/face covering may be **required** at any offsite field trip locations. Those are privately run venues and they set their own mask policy. All campers should bring a mask/face covering with them every day in case they need it. All campers have the option to wear masks during the entire day if they would like.

Daily Entrance In To Camp

By dropping your child off at camp each day, you are certifying the following:

1. You and your child do not have a temperature above 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit.
2. You and your child have not had Covid-19 in the last 14 days
3. You and your child have not had any signs or symptoms of a fever in the past 24 hours such as chills, sweats, felt “feverish,” or had a temperature that is elevated for you of 100.4 or greater?
4. You and your child do not have any of the following symptoms:
 - a. Fever or chills
 - b. Cough
 - c. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - d. Fatigue
 - e. Atypical muscle pain or body aches
 - f. Headache
 - g. Recent loss of taste or smell
 - h. Sore Throat
 - i. Congestion or runny nose
 - j. Nausea or Vomiting
 - k. Diarrhea
5. You and your child have not been exposed to, or come into contact with, anyone you know: (A) who has COVID-19, (B) who is/was being tested for COVID-19, (C) who had symptoms consistent with COVID-19, or (D) who was exposed to someone with COVID-19?

Daily Guidelines & Policies

1. Campers cannot not share items with other campers like food, drinks, or clothing items. This will be strictly enforced!
2. Campers should maintain physical distancing when possible at the direction of camp staff.
3. Campers should limit physical contact with other campers and staff as much as possible. This will be reinforced by camp staff.
4. Only camp staff should be carrying equipment to activity areas and carrying the equipment back to storage. No camper should take any piece of equipment that they have not been directed to take. All equipment will be going through regular cleaning, it is important that campers do not take equipment that they are not supposed to. This will be reinforced by camp staff.
